Situation
A Service Member cannot be dismissed from the Club by a Sub Branch Executive, even though he is a member of a Sub Branch.
Reference
<i>Club Constitution, Para 105, Sub Branch Process for Service Members</i>
<p>1. A Service Member <u>cannot</u> be expelled from the Club until the Sub Branch Executive advise the Club Executive of the full circumstances for the expulsion.</p> <p>2. Once the Club Executive have reviewed the relevant circumstances leading up to the Sub Branch determination to expel the Service Member, a final decision by the Club Executive on the expulsion shall be advised to the Sub Branch Executive and the Service Member.</p>
Result
<p>A Service Member became disadvantaged through his association with other members of a Sub Branch. When that Sub Branch tried to dismiss his membership due to his ongoing disruption within the Sub Branch, the Club Executive advised the Sub Branch Executive that it had no authority to dismiss him, regardless of what he had done. The Sub Branch Executive could only report his circumstances to the National Executive, with it's recommendation for dismissal.</p> <p>The final decision still belonged to the National Executive, who has the responsibility for every Service Member, whether to keep their membership or dismiss it.</p>
